

## INTRODUCTION



# The right to drinking water and sanitation is a fundamental human right



determinant of health. The availability of sufficient safe water for drinking and other domestic purposes was the most crucial and burning issue in the village of Astana Skardu. Around 1275 families including 508 indigenous and 767 Internally Displaced Populations (IDPs) were suffering from the lack of clean water supplies. It had significantly harmful impacts on the health of women and children of the displaced populations living in the village.

Moreover, children were seeking water for up to 6 hours instead of attending school. It was one of the major reasons for poor enrolment of children, especially girls, in schools. Although the national government, along with various other development agencies, did not pay attention to this major issue, it became the priority of GRACE Association.

To address the lack of sufficient drinking water, GRACE Association has developed this project. Its main objective was to improve the quality of life for 12,750 Distribution of financial contributions people, including the 7,670 members of the displaced population particularly women and female children, through the construction of safe drinking water supplies to all households in the village of Astana Skardu, Gilgit-Baltistan.


The project has developed three main activities: Firstly, 4 Kilometres of 160mm diameter pipeline has been installed to provide the drinking water need for the entire population of the target village.

The pipeline is used to transport water from the main water tank located near Sadpara Lake in Skardu City. Activities to raise the awareness of communities, reduce the work load of women and increase the enrolment of girls in school have then been undertaken. The construction of a water storage tank and installation

Safe drinking-water has been recognized as a major installation of distribution lines in Brolmo Colony greatly facilitated the success of these activities.

> Finally, considerable improvements of wastewater management systems have been made. Resilience has been introduced within affected communities through the creation of village water committees and women water committees.

> Community capacity building was of significance considering the sustainability of the project. Moreover, the community participation in socioeconomic development activities has been enhanced through a community based-approach.




The overall cost of the project is US\$ 136,078.50. Although, it is a considerable amount of money, different stakeholders have been contributed according to their own resources. The Government of Japan Embassy in Pakistan contributed a financial grant of US\$ 90,262.00. Local beneficiary communities participated up to US\$ 36,455.00 in kinds and services (i.e. lands, free labor and local materials). Finally, GRACE Association contributed a sum of US\$ 9,362.00 in cash and in terms of voluntary services.



## OUTCOME

## MANAGEMENT

The project was completed on 30th July 2010. The Astana Skardu village community participated more than expected. The following are the main outcomes of the project:

- Drinking water supplied to more than 1,300 households, including 767 displaced and 508 indigenous families.
- 2. Leisure time for women as the most benefited target group of the project has been extended. Instead of spending vast hours of the day hauling drink water for their families, women have time to attend to other domestic and personal activities. While local women have time to attend vocational skills and training programs i.e. sewing, knitting and embroidery and cosmetics, to name but a few, displaced women have time to work in the indigenous families' field to earn money for themselves.
- 3. Capacity building workshops have been conducted by GRACE Association to benefit women water committees. It contributed to the sustainable implementation of the project and enhanced the participation of women in socioeconomic development activities. GRACE Association conducted capacity building workshops for female water committees for sustainabilityof the project and to enhance their participation in socioeconomic development activities. Currently, women actively participate in women community meetings, they look after the water usages and control wastage of water and help the village water committee in the operation of water supply. More girls are attending schools due to the elimination of water hauling duties.
- Children from GRACE Public School have access to safe drinking water. Communities gave a special water connection to this school.

The project has been successfully managed by the GRACE Association Project Committee including Chief Executive Officer, Project Coordinator, Project Engineer, Admin and Finance Assistant and two Social Mobilizers.

Term of Responsibilities have been developed and signed by the project management staff as well as Memorandum of Understanding was signed with the village community elders and water committee members.

Community Volunteers have also been effectively involved in social mobilization phase which was highly effective productive.


GRACE Islamabad office and Program Office Skardu have supervised the whole project implementation period.

The project activities were implemented as per work plan designed in early consultation with the communities.

The village water committee comprising the village elders and notables as well as women water committee members has been very supportive to resolve all internal community issues and local resource mobilization for the project. They took full responsibility of arranging free unskilled labor for digging, installing pipe, filling of the pipelines and constructing Brolmo colony water tank and distributing pipelines. To resume, they completed all sorts of useful tasks.















Astana Community working on

#### 1 LEGAL STATUS

- 1.1 Grace Association, Pakistan was registered in the year 2007 as an independent Non Profit Organization (NPO) under the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan, Islamabad under section 42 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984. The registered office of Grace Association is situated in 27-E 3rd Floor office #5 Fazal-e-Haq road, Blue Area, Islamabad.
- 1.2 This is a project of Grace Association, Pakistan funded by Government of Japan through its embassy, to provide clean drinking water supply to displaced people in Village Astana Skardu in northern areas. The amount obligated under this Grant is US Dollars 90,262, to be expended according to project plan and budget prepared by the Grace Association, Pakistan. Moreover, the Association has also contributed in this project via project coordination and other administrative work. The period of project is 10 months starting from October 01, 2009 to July 31, 2010.
- 1.3 The Community has been involved in all stages of project identification, designing and would also institutionalize the system to manage the project after its completion. The community had also provided voluntary un skilled labor comprising of 50 to 75 workmen for the construction of the facility, the cost of which is estimated to Rs. 2.196 million, which is not accounted for in this Statement.

#### 2 PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The overall objective of the project is to improve the quality of life of the displaced population particularly women and female children. The overall objective will be achieved by accomplishing the following objectives:

- To provide clean drinking water to 100% families of the target area.
- To reduce the work load of women and raise their awareness for the home based business activities.
- To organize women water management committees for the sustainability of the project and enhance their participation in socioeconomic development activities.
- To increase the girl children enrolment in schools through awareness raising of the communities.



## 3 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## 3.1 Basis of preparation

This statement has been prepared on the cash receipt and payment basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

## 3.2 Revenue recognition

Grant is recognized as income on receipts basis.

## 3.3 Expenditures

Project expenditure are recorded as and when incurred.

## 3.4 Functional and presentational currency

These financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees, which is the Organization's functional and presentation currency.

#### 3.5 Cash and bank balances

Cash in hand and at bank are carried at nominal amount.

## 4 TRANSFERRED TO GRACE ASSOCIATION, PAKISTAN

This represents excess of receipt over expenditure due to conversion of USD into Pak Rupees and transferred to the Association bank account as approved by Board of Directors of Grace Association, Pakistan dated November 20, 2009.

## SUSTAINABILITY

## CHALLENGES

The project has been handed over to the communities.

From the initiation of the project the Village Water Committees and Women Water Committees have been constituted in each village.

A tariff Rs.20/- per household has been fixed to meet the operational expenses. It is currently operational in Brolmo colony.

GRACE conducted capacity building meetings/training workshops on project water supply, project management and operations. The committees' members have already started managing and operating the project by themselves in their respective villages.

Women are also involved in project sustainability. They are looking after the water waste by collecting fines on water-wasting families. However, the village elders raised the issue of the collection of money by women. Regarding local cultural sensitivities, GRACE Association agreed on the fact that male committee members will be collecting tariff by visiting home to home.

The Astana Community led by GRACE Skardu Office Staff aims at involving governmental institutions within the project. Links with the government line department i.e. Public Work Department (PWD) have been developed and Astana Community requested a water supply operator. This attempt was of great success as the Government has attributed a water supply operator for the main water tank. The Government Water Supply Operator has already started tasks he is in charge of.

The Astana village communities are developing their linkages with public representatives for handing over the water supply scheme to government line department for maintenance and sustainability. This dialogue is still on going and the VWC members are optimistic for their success in near future.

Although the project management team did not face any challenges during the implementation of the project, on completion of the project on June 2010, some conflicts with adjacent villages have been raised. In fact, the project raised the issue of the right to access to water.

Local politics have also contributed to the emergence of this problem. Although, this could have been the example of harmful impact this project could have had on communities, the Village Water Committee of Astana introduced dialogue with the conflicting people. The issue was solved by 1st August 2010.
